A new home, latrines and school supplies for the El Zapote community

On a Saturday evening, after a long trip and overnight stay in Managua, Nicaragua, twenty plus people from diverse Albertan towns and cities, unknown to each other, except by Catholic roots and faith, took a fourhour bus ride from Managua to the northern hills of El Zapote, Nicaragua. I was among this excellent company of boisterous, life-loving, humble youth, adults, elders, and fearless leaders Fr. Curtis, Pat Spiller, Chantal, Harol, bus driver Mario, and many more who made this journey possible.

On arriving we were met by the community gathered near a house, that served as their local store for basic amenities and community gathering area. We were warmly welcomed, introduced to our host families, and taken with our backpacks, luggage and arms laden with watermelons and fans to their homes.



Not unlike our apostolic ancestors, we were sent out in twos, threes or fours to our host homes, and found our way to communicate with them through broken Spanish, helpful translators or through human hearts full of warmth and good will. The face and heart of Christ was easily perceived by hearts so open to see.

I was grateful to be partnered with Naomi Wiper, whose Spanish was a gift for us to communicate together with the Castillo family once we arrived in their home! Cont'd on Page 2

Backpacks of Hope Three Years of Changing Lives Through Education



For the third year in a row, the Roots of Change Foundation is making a tangible difference in the lives of children in Nicaragua through the School Backpack Project. Thanks to the generosity and dedication of our supporters, we continue to expand our reach, ensuring that more students have the tools they need to succeed in school.

This year, 300 children and 17 teachers from three different communities have received essential school supplies. In the municipality of Villa Nueva, 75 children from the La Fragua community, who attend the Fe y Alegría School, are now equipped with the materials they need for learning. In Somotillo, two schools have been supported: Pablo Antonio Cuadra School, with 125 students and six teachers, and Cofradía Community School, with 100 students and six teachers. Cont'd on Page 2

Additionally, 17 preschool students in the Municipality of Cinco Pinos have also received supplies, made possible by a generous contribution from the Innisfall delegation working in the El Zapote Community.

During the last week of March, our dedicated team, FUNDACCO, traveled to Somotillo to personally deliver the school supplies, ensuring they reached the hands of eager students ready to learn.

The smiles on their faces and the excitement in their eyes remind us that these backpacks aren't just filled with pencils and notebooks—they're filled with hope, opportunity, and the promise of a brighter future.

When we started this initiative, we knew the power that something as simple as a school backpack could hold. A child with the right supplies has the confidence to learn, grow, and dream bigger. Seeing the impact firsthand over the past two years has reinforced our belief that education is a key pillar of change, and we are so proud to be part of this journey.

Our first mission trip team consisted of just Marie and I. This year, there were 20 members on our team, ranging in age from 13 to 66 years, coming from varied education, careers, ethnicity, marital status and geographical backgrounds. The first week we had the opportunity to work together, share reflections and attend Mass together. As well, we observed our team interacting and building new relationships with our host families and the El Zapote community. At the end of the first week, fifteen members of the team returned home.

With only five of us left, the second week was much quieter, as one might expect. It was special as well, giving us a chance to get to know each other better, and creating deeper and more intimate reflections with each other.

The highlights for us were watching the young members of our mission team play and interact with the children from our community, seeing how members of the team reached out to help others that were in need, daily sharing reflections, working together with the team and community members, spending time with our host family, having Father Curtis to lead us in daily Mass, and to share in Eucharistic celebration with our El Zapote family.

A Legacy of Compassion: How FUNDACCO Keeps Father Denis' Mission Alive



In the heart of Nicaragua, a quiet but powerful act of love continues—one that was never part of any formal program, yet has profoundly shaped the lives of some of the country's most vulnerable people. The **Señor de la Divina Misericordia de Boaco** project was never funded by Roots of Change; rather, it began as a personal initiative of our founder, Father Denis Hébert.

Today, it lives on through the unwavering dedication of FUNDACCO staff, who have taken it upon themselves to continue his mission.

Since Father Denis' passing in 2015, members of FUNDACCO have carried on this project in his honor, recognizing—just as he did—the deep importance of caring for the elderly.

FUNDACCO staff set aside a portion of their salaries, organize small fundraising efforts, and gather support from friends and colleagues to fund this initiative.

Once a year, their commitment comes to life in a day of care and dignity for the elderly residents of a nursing home in Boaco.

On this day, more than just supplies are

delivered. A doctor and a dentist visit to provide essential medical check-ups. A barber offers haircuts, ensuring residents feel cared for and respected. Food and other necessities, gathered with the guidance of Sister Reyna Almanza, the home's director, are provided to help meet the residents' needs.

These efforts are not about obligation—they are about love, respect, and the belief that every person deserves to be treated with dignity, no matter their circumstances.

Though this project was never part of Roots of Change's official work, we deeply admire FUNDACCO's commitment. Their dedication is a testament to the lasting impact of Father Denis' vision and the power of individuals to make a difference.

Let this story serve as a reminder: meaningful change isn't always about grand, organized efforts. Sometimes, it is simply about showing up—year after year—for those who need it most. We invite you to share this story, to be inspired, and to recognize that the smallest acts of kindness can leave the deepest impact.
